Greetings from the City of Hartford, City Council members and myself. It is an exciting time in Hartford. The city has added two additional housing developments to address housing needs along with a bike trail expansion, downtown markets and more. Everything points towards another great year in Hartford!

In the few months since I was appointed mayor, I have been looking ahead 5-10 years to see what the city needs to work on now to make us a vibrant community in the future. We have been reviewing our Hartford Master Plan with several community leaders and will begin implementation of these plans in the months ahead. Along with the Hartford Master Plan, the city is always reviewing and updating our Capital Improvement Plan or CIP. This is a roadmap for infrastructure needs in the next five-plus years. With the help of our city engineer and ISG, we are constantly looking at the needs of Hartford. Many great things are on the horizon.

A major project on the horizon is our new wastewater treatment facility. Plans are being produced so bidding on this project can take place in early 2023. Our scheduled completion/use date is in 2025. Watch for more to come on this project in the months ahead.

The City Council recently established a Park and Rec Committee to look at quality of life needs and to gather the necessary information for presentation to the Council. In the short time this group has been meeting, our dog park is proceeding, the bike trail extension to Main Street is beginning, and discussion on additional needs at the Swenson Sports Complex have been looked at.

The City of Hartford has more than 80 acres of park space for the public to enjoy. All city parks are open from 6:00 am to 11:00 pm year-round. If you have any questions, please contact City Hall by calling 605-528-6187.

Weekdays during the month of July, the City has a Summer Rec Program for children K-6th grade. With the recent hiring of a recreation director, the City hopes to expand its recreation offerings in the near future to provide opportunities for children and adults alike to do activities they love in their own community.

LYONS PARK (CITY PARK)

202 N. Vandemark Ave., Hartford, SD

Lyons Park is the City's flagship park and the location for Jamboree Days festivities as well as the Kids Summer Recreation program. Established in the early 1900s—thanks to the Lyons family— the park has continued to serve Hartford to present day. Hartford

residents commonly reserve the park's five shelters and amphitheater to host events such as family reunions, graduation parties, and other special events. Park shelters and amphitheaters can be reserved by calling City Hall. Reservations require a \$10 nonrefundable fee. Other park amenities include playground equipment, three ball diamonds, horseshoe pits, tennis courts, a basketball court, and a sand volleyball court. Horseshoes can be rented at City Hall for free (\$35 refundable cash/ check deposit). Public restrooms are available and the sidewalk circles the park for recreational walking.

HARTFORD SWIMMING POOL

Lyons Park is also home to the City Pool. The City Pool typically opens the last day of school and closes mid to late August. Season passes are available at City Hall or the pool and pass fees are \$43.00 per individual. Admission fees for children 0-4 is free and 5 & older is \$3.00. The pool also offers swimming lessons in June and July. Visit **Hartfordsd.us** or contact City Hall at 605-528-6187 about registration information.



TURTLE CREEK PARK

Turtle Creek Park is the City's newest and largest park spanning 34 acres. Turtle Creek Park offers plenty of open space for activities. The park is connected to the bike recreation trails by the apple orchard along Hartford's southern border. The park features playground equipment, a 9-hole disc golf course, and a junior ball field. Discs can be rented at City Hall for free (\$25 refundable cash/check deposit). Another park shelter is available here to be reserved, and public restrooms are conveniently available on-site.

SWENSON SPORTS COMPLEX

1610 N. Western Ave., Hartford, SD

Swenson Sports Complex currently has two multi-use diamonds with 300-foot fences. Two more diamonds and concession stand/bathroom are planned for the future. The SSC is also home to six soccer fields that host teams

ranging from U5-U12. Soccer space is planned to increase in the future and a concession stand/bathroom addition is planned for that section of the complex as well.

CENTURY PARK

201 N. Main Ave., Hartford, SD

Century Park is Harford's smallest park at half an acre, located downtown, it provides a quaint space of tranquility. Century Park is home to the Veterans Memorial and Hartford Time Capsule. A plaque describing Hartford's history is also located at the park as well as the flag disposal box managed by the Hartford American Legion. Benches and gazebos line the park which serves as the host to the annual Christmas tree lighting during Hartford's Hometown Christmas celebration. Stop by to learn more about Hartford's history and pay respect to Hartford's heroes.

BIKE & RECREATION TRAILS

Hartford has more than three combined miles of paved path systems for the recreation needs of residents. The path starts in Turtle Creek Park and splits off down Highway 38 and Colton Road. Hartford continues to extend the path system and add improvements yearly.

In 2019, the Bike & Recreation Committee added three trail maps at heads of the trail. Hartford also has a nature trail that begins at the eastern end of Turtle Creek Park and extends down to its southern border along the apple orchard. View the map on page 8 for more information.

The Downtown Hartford Market is back in action! The farmer's market kicked off on June 2nd and will continue on Main Avenue in Downtown Hartford on the first Thursday of the month in July, August and September – plus there is an end-of-season bonus planned for Sept. 29th. Hours for the handmade/home grown market are 5:00-8:30 p.m. with shopping, food, and entertainment available.

About 30 vendors will be selling unique handmade crafts and fresh food products including seasonal produce, baked goods, farm eggs, pasture raised and organic meats, spices/seasonings, canned and pickled items, honey, soap, dog treats, yard games, woodworking, crocheted and sewn items, décor, and much more.

Downtown Market is now in its fourth year, said Callie Tuschen, market coordinator and president of Downtown Hartford Inc. "We expect 2022 to be our biggest season yet. It's rewarding to watch the community come together every month to shop and socialize in the heart of our town."

There will be live music, two food trucks, and family friendly activities at every market throughout the season. New this year are touch-a-truck opportunities with the Sheriff's Department and Hartford Area Fire & Rescue. The Sanctuary Petting Zoo will bring animals out later in the season. Youth are invited to learn about entrepreneurship by participating in the market at a reduced rate.

FIBER BROADBAND HAS BEEN A MAINSTAY IN HARTFORD AREA FOR NEARLY A DECADE



With fiber optic technology already in the ground here, Golden West recently upgraded its network equipment to boost speeds. Hartford area residents now enjoy speeds starting at 250 Mbps and going up to a blazing 5 Gig.

Fiber optic technology is out of this world: literally. When NASA sent Apollo 7 to orbit the moon in 1968, the crew broadcast live from outer space on televisions equipped with fiber optics. The technology was so new, it was classified as "confidential," and operators required special security clearance.

Today, even earthbound folks enjoy the benefits of fast and secure fiber connections. Hartford area residents have had fiber optic broadband internet service as early as 2013, when Golden West began upgrading the Minnehaha County community.

FIBER BENEFITS BOTH TOWN & RURAL CUSTOMERS

Golden West recognized the superiority of fiber optics early on and made upgrading its infrastructure through the Fiber to the Home (FTTH) project a top priority. The Hartford area's fiber upgrade nine years ago was a game-changer for people like Jesse Fonkert.

He stepped into a new role as president and CEO of Sioux Metro Growth Alliance on April 1, 2020 — just as the pandemic was gathering steam and offices were closing down. Thanks to a Golden West fiber connection, the Hartford resident was able to work remotely from home while learning the ropes.

"It's tough starting a job in the middle of a pandemic, especially when you serve more than one municipality," Jesse says. "Part of the job is knowing your stakeholders. Since we couldn't meet in person, I did a lot of videoconferencing with a bunch of folks that I serve."

Jesse's wife, Kelsey, had started a new job in January 2020. Like her husband, she found herself working from home, too. Both were able to access important files in the cloud and relied on Zoom calls to meet with colleagues and constituents.

"Thankfully, our fiber connection is incredibly stable and strong," Jesse says. "It allowed us both to work from home and do the best work we could under the circumstances."

While Jesse and Kelsey live in town, rural residents outside Hartford and elsewhere also benefit from fiber connections. Misti Hostutler of Midland traveled for the first 11 years of her career in the information

technology field. Once she was hooked up to fiber, she began working from home instead.

"I am able to help on our family farm, raise our two children and still bring in a salary from my job," Misti says. "I love being able to have a career and still be able to be a stay-at-home mom and wife."

FIBER IS FUTURE-PROOF

Fiber optics are made of long, flexible strands of glass slightly thicker than a human hair. They use pulses of light to transmit data over longer distances and at higher bandwidths than copper cables, which rely on electricity. This allows for speeds that aren't only faster, but symmetrical – meaning the data speed and file transfer rates are identical for both uploads and downloads.

Fiber is limited only by other equipment in the network. With fiber already in the ground, Golden West recently upgraded its network equipment to boost speeds, allowing Hartford area residents to get the maximum benefit from their broadband connections.

With speeds here starting at 250 Mbps and going up to a blazing 5 Gig, Golden West subscribers enjoy fast, reliable, and secure connections ideally suited for today's fast-paced lifestyle. Whether telecommuting, remote learning, streaming, gaming, or taking

To date, Golden West has placed about 9,500 miles of fiber in the ground. The cooperative is working to upgrade its entire service territory to fiber within the next five or six years.

That's one small step for man, but one giant leap for South Dakotans who depend on fast and reliable broadband connections.



GREAT MEAT AND TABLE-READY MEALS AT HARTFORD'S NEW **CREEKSIDE MEATS**

In the fall of 2021, a vision of two friends, Casey Remmers and Troy Grocott, became a reality when Creekside Meats opened its doors in downtown Hartford. The business was seeded after a brainstorming session about 18 months earlier during the first few months of the pandemic. At that time, food supply chains were disrupted and the importance of a local supplier of meats and related products was demonstrated more than ever.

The pandemic acted as a catalyst to get the ball rolling to open Creekside Meats, but the knowledge and passion for the business was well in place much earlier. Casey Remmers originally is from Orient, S.D., where he grew up helping out at his parents' steakhouse. Being a part of a family-owned and operated business gave him the background necessary to make Creekside Meats a success.

"My parents ran their steakhouse for over 42 years," Casey said. "This is where I learned the business and how to produce great food like we provide at Creekside Meats." The new company is also a family affair as Casey's parents (who now live in the area) help at the business as do Casey's sisters and his two sons.

When Casey and Troy, who farms near Buffalo Trading Post, were looking for potential cities to start the business, they felt Hartford was the best location. "We looked at other towns in the area to start the business, but we felt Hartford made the most sense because it's a rapidly growing town and it has a strong sense of community," Casey said. This small-town feel has served them well as residents are easily able to stop by when coming home from work. It's easy in-and-out to grab a few steaks or a pre-made meal.

Creekside Meats falls under the label of "Specialty Grocery Store," which means they offer great cuts of meat as well as pre-made, table-ready meals and dishes. "All our steaks are aged in house," said Casey. "We take pride in producing a wide range of great products from local beef, pork and poultry producers in the area." Creekside Meats smokes all their meats on-site and prepares their sides and dishes on location as well.

The Hartford area community has supported the business and people are coming back to try new things all the time. "Our catering and take-out business has done





really well," he said. "For example, during the Super Bowl, we did over 100 orders for our customers' parties. Graduation season was also great for us as we smoked over 3000 pounds of pork butts."

Creekside Meats makes their own take-and-bake pizzas with options that are low carb and gluten free as well as traditional pizza selections. Casey is known for his "Casey's Steak Seasoning" which is sold in various sizes of packaging. It's labeled as steak seasoning, but it is good on pork and chicken as well.

Creekside Meats also carries items from local companies who produce various food-related products beyond just their own in-house labeled items.

The long-term plan for Creekside Meats is to grow as demand dictates and offer additional services in time. In a specialty grocer-type business, Casey said the goal of his dedicated team is to make great food and give customers a great experience every time they come in the door.

We try to develop skills in our employees and they appreciate that," he said. "I'll be living in Hartford so I can be right there to ensure the success of the store."





HARTFORD FIRE & RESCUE MARKS 120 YEARS OF SERVICE

One hundred twenty years ago, civic leaders took a vital step to protect the property and lives of Hartford area residents. In early November 1902, a meeting was held for the purpose of establishing a fire department for the city of Hartford. The Hartford Fire Department became a reality with 14 members on Nov. 17, 1902.

A play, a picnic, and some basket socials were put on as fundraisers to pay for the new Seagrave Co. fire truck. In January 1904, the department purchased a fire bell from Sioux Falls for \$21.55.

Fire department membership expanded from 20 to 30

members in 1917. In 1922, the E.A. Wendt fire took place in which the hardware and implement building burned, probably the biggest fire in Hartford history. In 1926, the department installed a siren to signal fires. It also was sounded every day to indicate 12 noon.

A farm fire board was established in 1953 to help fund the department from the rural population and the department took on the responsibility of rural fire protection. In 1985, the fire department and FIRSTHELP combined in 1985 to become Hartford Fire & Rescue.

The list of fire trucks in the early days reads like a

Mon-Tues, Thurs-Fri: 8am - Noon, 4pm - 6pm Wed: Open by Appointment Only Sat: 8am - Noon Sun: 1pm - 6pm history of the automobile and included: 1903 Model A hook and ladder truck; 1939 International pumper; 1952 Jeep (set up for grass fires), 1954 International pumper; 1969 Chevrolet combination tanker/pumper; and 1969 Diamond Reo tanker.

The first building to house the fire department was located at the corner of 2nd and Main. In 1957, the city purchased the Ole Voekler building just south of 2nd in the business district and it was converted into the city hall and fire station. The station built in 1985 was constructed with all volunteer labor.






